DI STANCE TO AI RPORT: Approximately 32 Km (50 – 60 min) from the new International Airport "El. Venizelos".

COST OF TAXI : €23-28

SUPERMARKET: Opposite the Marina entrance across tram & main coast road.
Opening Hours: Monday – Friday 09:00 am – 20:00 p.m.,
Saturday 09:00 am – 18:00 p.m. **Sunday closed**.
There are also vans from supermarkets inside the Marina, working practically all hours but they are more expensive (beware of Taxi drivers pouncing on you the moment you arrive!).

DOCUMENTS REQUI RED: Passports, Charter contract copy, Sailing (or motor boat) licence for one member of the crew compulsory. Sailing licence, if available, for a second crew member otherwise attestation of their sailing experience.
Crew list with names and passport numbers.

ADMINISTRATION FEE:	€153 Payable at the time of embarkation by cash, traveller's cheques or certified bank cheques, to cover local administration costs and linen.
CLEANING AND FUEL:	Payable locally in Euro (Fuel approx €1/litre, cleaning €50).
SECURITY DEPOSIT INSURANCE:	€100 Payable at the time of embarkation by cash, traveller's cheques or certified bank cheques.
WEATHER FORECAST:	Every day at 13:30 – 13:50 p.m. in English at 1008 kHz. Also VHF Channel 25 at set times.
VHF:	Channel 16, call sign "OLYMPIA RADIO" (weather forecast also available)

Kiriacoulis staff will be expecting you till sunset. If you arrive later, you will have to board alone, finding the keys in the yacht's cockpit. Check-in will be done in the morning. Kiriacoulis boats are moored either side of their office on Pier 2.

Cruising Area: The Saronic Gulf and Eastern Peloponnese

From Kalamaki marina, you can follow two main sailing routes: The Saronic route and the Cyclades route. The Saronic islands of Aegina, Poros, Angistri, Hydra, Dokos, Spetses and the Peloponnesian coast offer smooth sailing sheltered from strong winds.

The Saronic route is highly recommended for easy sailing, especially in July and August to avoid the strong winds blowing down in the Cyclades, also for a shorter break of less than two weeks. Along this route you will find many Cosmopolitan towns, ancient temples, Byzantine castles, small fishing ports and unspoiled anchorages.

You should not miss a visit to Poros (Russia Bay is an excellent anchorage and only a 30 min walk into town), Hydra, Spetses, also Yerakas, Leonidion, Monemvasia (referred to as the Greek Gibraltar), Elaphonissos and Kithira will also surprise you for their natural beauty, sandy beaches, the totally unspoiled and friendly small ports and peaceful anchorages (although perhaps too far away for a 7 day charter). Popular harbors (such as Aegina Town) can be very busy during the peak season. Ensure you arrive early to obtain a mooring space and be prepared to raft up, or go bows to, with other boats.

If you wish to visit Epidhavros Theatre then moor in Palaia Epidhavros and take a taxi (around €30 for a return trip with 1 hour on site). A short hop from there is Vathi, a lovely quiet spot on the Methana peninsula.

Weather & Wind

The Meltemi (winds from the North usually strong especially in July and August) does not blow as regularly as it does in the Cyclades or the Dodecanese, if it does blow from North to North East, its strength is usually about force 4-5, it is normally less around the Methana peninsula and Poros.

If the Meltemi does not blow, the wind is generally from the South, force 2-3. In the Hydra Gulf and Argolic Gulf, the wind is mostly from the South East, blowing force 3-5 dying down at night.

On the Eastern Peloponnesus coast, the wind may be a weak Meltemi from the North East or a southerly usually from the South East. During spring and autumn, the winds are normally weaker and from the South over the whole area.

Itineraries in the Saronic and Argolic Gulfs

The following routes are suggested. These itineraries are biased towards tranquil and unspoiled ports rather than touristy hubs like Tiros or Porto Heli.
